2. There are many agencies of the UN which work on common world problems. Two of them are:

United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) (Paris) was created in 1946. It promotes international collaboration in education, science and culture.

United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) (New York City) was created by the UN General Assembly in 1946. It works for children rights, their development, protection and Survival.
