Ans. The words which are used for or instead of nouns are called pronouns.

Q.2 How many kinds are there in pronoun?

Ans. There are ten types of pronoun-

1. Personal pronouns
2. Interrogative pronoun
3. Indefinite pronoun
4. Relative pronoun
5. Possessive pronoun
6. Reflexiv epronoun
7. Emphasizing pronoun
8. Demonstrative pronoun
9. Reciprocal pronoun
10. Distributive pronoun
